Martin, my editor and daughter, has revised "As He Is" for this issue, and you will want to note the few changes that have been made in this research first published more than eight years ago. However, its electrifying message remains the same: As *He* is, so are *we* in this world.

Take time to read and study this issue thoroughly—give copies to your friends and enemies. It will bless you—and them—real good.

I look forward with great expectation to seeing you at the Rock of Ages '77. It will be a time to joy and rejoice in the light of God's healing deliverance and manifested love.
