"There is a time for all things, but there is only ONE thing for all times, and that is the Hope."

"Hope anticipates, believing appropriates (takes it to itself), then there is love, and love activates both believing and hope."

"One of the tricks of the Adversary was to put the four Gospels into the New Testament."

"Hope is something that is always future, something that is not available right now."

"People in the Old Testament, when they believed in the first coming of Jesus Christ, were they saved? Definitely. But were they born again? No. That is why they are going to be in the resurrection."

A peek into the east end of the immense warehouse would reveal to you the kitchen area where crews are scrubbing the serving pans from supper and preparing your breakfast for the morning.

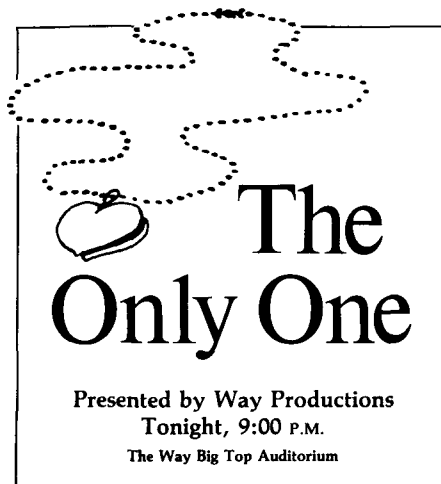
