Today's theme for the Rock of Ages is "Day of the Land." The many events prepared for the day are designed to teach a greater appreciation for the God-given animal, vegetable and mineral resources we have, as well as proper stewardship of them.


Beginning at 7:00 a.m. in the Main Tent, the day will open with prayer, songs and fellowship. Later in the morning, Mr. Andrew Skapura, former employee of the U.S. Soil Conservation Service and current specialized nutrition consultant, will speak.

The afternoon schedule includes sharings by individuals experienced in organic gardening, food drying, canning, grinding wheat and sprouting. Dr. Gabriel Ortiz who grows a variety of vegetables in wading pools in his Florida home and Ohio native Ruth Hess who specializes in hydroponics (gardening in water instead of soil) will be sharing on container gardening.

Tours to the Brookside Laboratory in New Knoxville, the foremost soil, plant and animal nutrition research center in the United States, will be available beginning at 1:00 p.m. Registration for the tours will be handled at the Garden Display Tent next to the Children's Zoo until 12:00 noon.

Featured at the Children's Zoo are pony rides from 9:00-10:30 a.m. and from 1:00-4:00 p.m. There will also be a sheep dog demonstration at 3:00 p.m.

"I was asked to be in the teenagers' play that's going on here this week," reported an enthused young man.


"I lost my sleeping bag," said another young man. "One guy in Bless Patrol tracked it down after an hour and brought it back to me."
