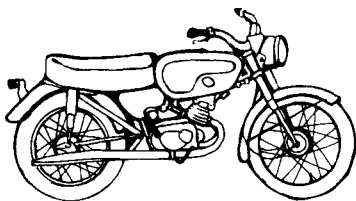
WOWS IN TRAINING

The 1980-81 Word over the World Ambassadors begin the first training ever conducted during the Rock of Ages this morning in the Living Room Tent. This week, all of us have the privilege of contributing our prayers, love and believing as the Word of God is taught to our WOW Ambassadors for their year of service. The training will culminate on Friday night when they are commissioned.

There will be a concentration of WOW families in 12 outreach cities in the USA: Chicago, Portland, Dayton, Phoenix, Miami, Minneapolis, Washington D.C., Virginia Beach, Philadelphia, Houston, Denver and Atlanta, and in Canada: Toronto. Ambassador families will also be moving the Word in other American cities and brother-and-sister countries and territories.

The Mini WOWs will be busy also. Their morning training will center around their role as ambassadors for Christ. Afternoon workshops will involve instruction on grooming, etiquette and other practical topics. The Mini WOW song will be presented on Friday at the Gazebo.

THE BRIGHT HORIZON

Psalms 24:1:

The earth is the Lord's, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein.

With this verse Dr. Wierwille opened the Wednesday fellowship at dawn for "Day of the Land." "Men don't really own the land. They use it; but they cannot take it with them," he continued.

Several thousand early risers heard him go on to share his love for farming. "I don't know where this "Day of the Land" will take us; but I do know you people are the ones who have to do what needs to be done for our land."

"It was a very tough decision to make this farm the grounds for the Rock of Ages. There are no beans or corn growing here now. But a letter I received blessed me very much. This person said he believed this farm feeds the spiritual needs of people all around the world."

Dr. Wierwille next presented a video which brought out the alarming, widespread misuse of our farmlands. Each year many acres are turned into highways, housing projects, man-made lakes and golf courses. Because of greed, land-use plans are very short-sighted.

The 9:30 a.m. fellowship in the Main Tent and the presentations around Rock of Ages '80 at 1:00 p.m. instructed believers in many skills of stewarding the land, including soil testing, fertilizing with manure, gardening, sprouting, food drying, composting, and canning.

The horizon is bright for our land as believers develop a new appreciation and love for the soil and their stewardship of it. The "Day of the Land" has called to mind that learning is an exciting adventure.

Tom Jenkinson and Frank Herron shared in the afternoon session on "Teaching." They approached their subject, "Word in Government," from the positive approach of "What is the believer's role in government?" Mr. Jenkinson said, "It's a cop-out for American citizens to say that they don't know enough. I'll tell you [believers], you have a source of information that Brinkley hasn't even thought of yet. Get involved by praying, voting and corresponding with your representatives."

Compassion was the emphasis Vince Finnegan placed on his teaching on "Undershepherding and Counseling" in the "Fellowship" portion of the series. "Right at the center of compassion is great forgiveness," he said. "When you're moved with compassion, then signs, wonders and miracles will happen."

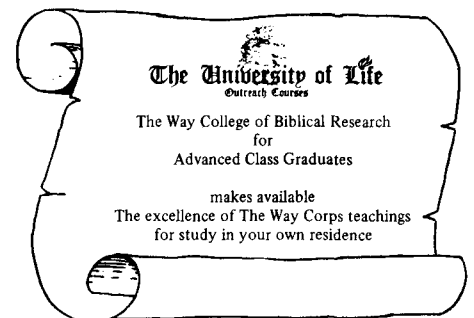
