
The House of His Healing Presence

DORMITORY DEDICATION

On Friday, August 9, 1985, the Board of Trustees of The Way International dedicated Founders' Hall, the new dormitory here at Headquarters. Mrs. Victor Paul Wierwille, accompanied by Mrs. Ermal L. Owens and Mrs. H.E. Wierwille, cut the ribbon to officially open the new facility.

Founders' Hall, located northeast of the Outreach Services Center, is dedicated to the first Board of Trustees, commemorating their work of believing and labor of love in the foundational years of building our worldwide ministry.

The building is 70,328 square feet

and will be used to house approximately one hundred first-year and one hundred graduating Way Corps for in-residence training this fall.

The \$5 million facility, which was built in only eleven months, has 139 sleeping rooms, for both married couples and singles, five lounges, six study rooms, and a laundry room.

To have this facility in such a short length of time to house and train God's people here at Head-quarters is, as Mr. Howard R. Allen, Secretary-Treasurer of The Way International, commented at the dedication ceremony, "a miracle."
