SIX KEYS TO RENEWED-MIND HEALTH:

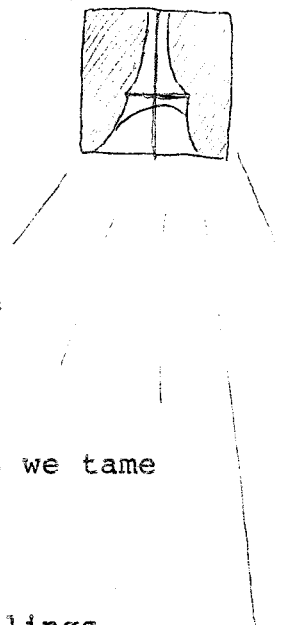
- (1) Believe the Word.
