## Teaching Techniques by Cindy Bernardini International Children's Fellowship 1984

- I. GOAL: That the children learn the principles of God's Word and HOW TO APPLY THEM.
  - A. Don't water down the Word.
  - B. Command their attention because of your enthusiasm.
- II. A good teacher will:
  - A. Be accurate
    - 1. Prepare yourself to the point that you know the record without having to read every word.
      - a. Figures of speech
      - b. Orientalisms
      - c. Mistranslations
      - d. Sequence of events
    - 2. You don't have to teach all you know, but the quality of your teaching improves if you know the background.
  - B. Keep it simple
    - 1. Paraphrase and summarize where it will help.
    - 2. Stick to one topic. Don't go off on tangents.
  - C. Use repetition for memorization
    - 1. Retemories
    - 2. Phrases
    - 3. Actions
    - 4. Bring to their attention the desired principle as it appears in the record.
  - D. Involve the children
    - 1. Questions
    - 2. Reading
    - 3. Direct application of principle during the course of the teaching
  - E. Use visual aids
    - 1. Special props
      - a. Costumes--be as accurate as possible
      - **b.** Puppets

- c. Teaching settings
  - 1) Outdoors
  - 2) Design special effects indoors
- 2. Objects--be sure they relate to the topic.
- 3. Flannelgraphs, chalkboards, videos.
- F. Dramatize the teaching
  - 1. Skit
  - 2. Character teaching
  - 3. Way Productions
  - 4. Story
- G. Utilize guest teachers
  - 1. Other adults
  - 2. Older children
    - a. Be sure they are prepared.
    - b. Hear their teaching before it is given, if possible. Accuracy is still your responsibility as a Twig coordinator.
- H. Be flexible
  - 1. Vary your location and approach
    - a. Field trips
    - b. Work
    - c. Special skills
    - d. Discussions
      - 1) For older children
      - 2) Choose a practical situation
      - 3) Document solutions with the Word
      - 4) Builds reasoning ability and desire to study
- 1. Your meeting should flow from one thing to the next. NO  $\underline{\text{DEAD}}$   $\underline{\text{TIME}}$ .
- III. After a good teaching your children will:
  - A. Remember the record taught in sequence.
  - B. Be able to relate the principles learned.
  - C. Apply the principles.
  - D. Teach others.
