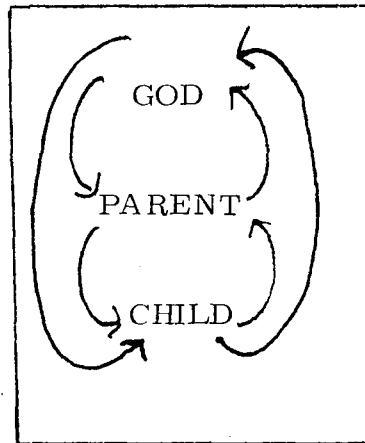

 - a. Not a burden
2. Never confess that you can't do anything with your child.

3. Never confess that you don't know what to do about your
child. Ephesians 1:5-8, 17-23
4. Never tell your child he is a bad boy or girl. Give them
a fine reputation to live up to.
5. Never threaten.

1. Patience

DEFINITION:

*PATIENCE - Quiet perseverance; steadfastness, fixed in direction. Endurance, fortitude, implies calmness, stability and persistent courage in trying circumstances.

- a. Emphasis is placed on the parent and on how he overcomes the situation.
- b. Never let your child take advantage of you.
- c. Never give up. Does God give up on us?
- d. Just renew the mind to the Word and change.
- e. One of the nine fruit of the spirit - Galatians 5:22.
- f. You must be willing to tell your child something until he remembers it.
- g. How many times does God tell us until we finally do **what** He asks?
- h. Teach your child to listen, which takes repetition with reproof and correction.
- i. Believe and continue to build your believing for your child and in your child.
