


# the VOId speaks! by Dr. Victor Paul Wierwille

One of the most heartening and satisfying experiences in the life of any Christian man and woman is the consciousness of being used in the great work of God's Kingdom. The knowledge of having a very definite part in bringing the resources of God's eternal love into reality in the life of not one person but many.

Tithing will quickly give you the sense of working in harmony with God's will, thus knowing that not only much good will be coming through you to others, but to you also, for God is a respector of the conditions you fulfill. It is just natural for a tither to be instinctively conscious of partnership with God. This knowledge is no longer just lip service to God, but concrete, and tangible.

Have you ever seen a church that is poor? A

church where the people have a difficult time meeting their financial obligations? Have you ever seen a church that is losing ground, in members as well as spirituality? Have you ever seen a church where they had to have all kinds of special suppers. parties, selling stunts? Have you ever seen a church where they had to make an individual member canvass for raising the stipulated budget? Show me that church and I will show you the membership of a church not tithing. For a tithing church has "meat in my house." This is God's Word, therefore, it is true.

A tithing church is a prosperous church. A tithing church is a spiritual church. A tithing church has all the facilities it needs to do the work of Christ. A tithing church has a growing

membership. A tithing church has God's blessing upon it, therefore, the people are happier, healthier and are more prosperous. As you tithe, so you prosper. This is true for a church as well as an individual. Just plain business logic would call upon every man to tithe, even if there were no spiritual blessings guaranteed.

While we are considering plain logic in this lesson, let us look at some of the questions most frequently asked.

Surely a Christian does not have to tithe, for the law of the tithe is an ancient law and I believe that Christians are free from all the bondage of the ancient law?

That is right you are free, but who made you free? Who prospers you? Who owns what you have in money or goods? Who is first in your life? Does a Christian neglect or obey the ancient law regarding murder? A Christian is never under

law, he is above it, beyond it; therefore, he goes the second mile. But plain logic says you can not go the second mile until after you have gone the first. A Christian under love goes beyond the tithe, according as he is prospered.

"I don't feel like I want to tithe."

Friend, it does not depend upon how you or I may feel. God said, "tithe." You must prod yourself to start doing what you know is the will of God. It takes a little push on your part. A Christian must do the will of God to have the blessings of God.

"Doesn't everything we have belong to God?"

Indeed it does as a sacred trust, but to prove it you are to pay one tenth of your increase of that of which you are a steward.

"Isn't a Christian supposed to 'give until it hurts'?"

NO! He is to give joyously. A Christian gives with pleasure and happily, for he knows that thereby

He and Henry Ford took the Lord at His word that it pays to tithe and give to the Lord. the master, that his steward had and was wasting the master's goods. (2) And the master called his steware and said. What is this I hear of thee? Give back the account book to me plus my signet ring, for maybe thou canst no longer be my steward. (3) Then the steward said to himself, what shall I do? If my master takes away my stewardship? I cannot dig: to beg I am ashamed. (4) Oh, I know what I will do, so that

if I am put out of the stewardship, that then they who are now my master's creditors may receive me into their houses. (5) So he called to him each one of his master's creditors and said to the first, How much owest thou unto my master? (6) And he said, An hundred baths (850 gallons) of oil. And he said to him, quickly sit down and take thy written report and write fifty. (7) Then said he to another. And how much owest thou? And he said, An hundred cors (1000 bushels of wheat). And he said unto him, take thy written report and write eighty. (8) And the master commended the steward for his skillful and discreet management who had been falsely and maliciously accused as unjust. For the children of this world are in their generation more

skillful and discreet than the children of light. (9) And I say unto you be on friendly terms with the skillful and discreet of this world that if the need arise they may receive you and care for you in their dwelling as long as you live. (10) He that is faithful in that which is the least is faithful also in the most: And he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in the most. (11) If ye therefore have not been skillful and discreet in your management of things of this world, who will commit to your trust the keeping of the spiritual truths? #### Highlights on Luke 16:1-12

A steward in Bible days was not a servant. He had full charge over all the servants and the household as well. He acted for his master in all matters. He was not paid a salary. He was part of the family, although not a blood relative. It was considered the highest of honors to be selected as a steward. He was given the master's signet ring which means power of attorney to put the master's official seal on legal papers: to buy and sell, engage and fire servants, allot money to the master's wife, appear in court in behalf of the master. In other words, the steward stands next to the master himself in all matters. He can forgive debts. It is therefore, of great importance that a steward be both skillful, discreet, wise and honest with much love.

Through the years he had kept record, but not required from the hands of two of the poor creditors all that was due his master. Stewards had this right. For if in the event the future would be bad for his master or himself, those to whom they had served as benefactors would then become their benefactors in return. It is an Eastern practice even to this day.

In this story it was oil and wheat. These serve as foods. In the East if a man is hungry or left destitute, if he steals oil and wheat, the judge will not penalize him but will say, "It was for his stomach, he has to live, let him go." This steward was not unjust as so many have taught, but just the opposite, if you understand Bible customs, practice and usage.

"I can't see tithing but I he is opening all the channels for God's abundant prosperity.

"What proportion do I give?"

You haven't given anything to God until after you have first paid what you OWE Him. God says that one tenth is a debt we owe and it is the most sacred of them all. After you have paid your honest debt to God, then whatever you give is true giving. According to the Word your giving is to be in proportion to your receiving. If God has blessed you bountifully, give bountifully; for "God loveth a cheerful giver."

"I am in debt. Should I pay my honest debt first before I start giving my tithe?"

Which is your most honest debt? Your debt to God. Pav it first and you will find that your other debts will soon clear up. Nine tenths with God's blessing will go farther than ten tenths without God's blessing.

am liberal in giving."

Liberal in what? Paying only a portion of your debt to God. You owe Him the tithe. Liberality does not start until after your tithe is paid.

"You talk about paying the tithe to God; how can I do that?"

You can't. But, God has much faith in you His child. You believe and know His plan of redemptive love and He is insistent that you take His money and spend it wisely where it will do the most good for His glorious work. This is where stewardship comes in. Stewardship is where one is trusted to use another person's property for that other person's purposes. Always remember the tithe money is His, not yours. That is why people get poorer in the keeping of it.

"I can not afford to tithe." ics, you can. You can not afford not to tithe. For in tithing you open yourself to God's abundance. You

take your foot off the hose and you start believing God. If you will try you will keep it up. God loves and honors people who will prove Him.

Jesus was accused of many violations of the ancient law; but none of those who were watching for some cause of offense in him ever accused him of neglecting the tithe.

Everybody knows that the usual way of raising money for the Church has something the matter with it.

It makes Christians into coaxers and beggars.

It makes sincere Christians ashamed, that the work of the Church is done on that money of mendicancy.

It puts means above ends: we are forced to give concerts for money, not music; to hold suppers for profit, not sociability; to distribute books for a commission, not instruction; and generally to degrade and pauperize the greatest business on earth.

It makes the money bag

the measure of recognition, and mortgages the Church's conscience to its heavy givers.

It uses time and strength in getting the tools for the work, which ought to be spent on the work itself. (The time used by a certain financial ways and means committee in the course of a year is estimated at one man's working time for three hundred years.)

With all its other disadvantages, some people might defend it if it did not work, but it is a self-confessed failure. Like the perpetual motion machine in the Patent Office, it is highly complicated and very ingenious, but it won't work.

Any one who thinks about it knows that the paying of the tithe as a sign of stewardship has nothing whatever the matter with it.

It saves the Christian's self-respect. He need not apologize either for doubtful methods or inadequate results.
