Written from London, October 25, just before sailing for India.


We ministered at Macclesfield, Manchester and Sun-




Ministering healing at the close of the service. Cavendish Congregational Church, Manchester, England.

ningdale, England. At Macclesfield the power of God was tremendously in evidence and had we been able to make arrangements to stay a few weeks a great spiritual revival would have been underway. They asked us to stop on our return if only for a week if at all possible, but if not, to be sure to return from America to England with this wonderful Gospel of deliverance as soon as possible. Macclesfield is hungry. Many wonderful friends are there; Rev. Sains and Baker, but none better than a Mr. and Mrs. R. Hooley who first stood with us boldly and who opened the original doors to England.

A Branch of The Way, Inc., has now been opened in England with headquarters at Macclesfield and Mr. Hooley as the Overseer. Praise God!

The sessions at Manchester were closed with teaching only to those who were invited with the exception of the Wednesday night healing service which was a public meeting and which I addressed on John 9. A pleasant surprise to me was

the arrival of a big bus load of people from Macclesfield for the service. Rev. Alex Holmes, pastor of the famous Cavendish Congregational church, the pulpit of which was made famous by the former Dr. Joseph Parker for whom later City Temple in London was built, said, "Such expository preaching has not been heard here since Alexander Mc-Laren's day." God really blessed. Rev. Holmes has introduced healing services on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons and hundreds have been delivered the last 10 months. More than 40 churches have started healing services under the inspiration of Holmes. The Congregational Christian ministers of England are reaching out for added light. I spoke to more than 40 of them at a special gathering for the purpose of introducing Christian healing into the churches' ministry. Rev. Holmes in addition to being so ably helped by volunteers from his own church (must be a dozen or more) is capably assisted by Rev. Angus Roderick. another young Congregational Christian minister in Manchester.

At Sunningdale, which is only 15 miles out of London on the way to Windsor, the summer home of the Royal Family, we gathered with a group of scholars for a two day spiritual retreat. Dr. E. C. Carpenter, an outstanding English Doctor of Osteopathy and President of the Lamp Press, Inc. of London, acted as Chairman and the retreat was held at beautiful Shrubs Hill Grange. Most scholars are hungry but skeptical, yet this group's doubts were quickly quelled for the Word of God is the Will of God.

So we closed our present visit in England with great joy and thanksgiving. You have been with us all the way for you are the ones who are helping to make this Missionary Teaching and Training Tour possible. God bless you and don't forget to aid us with a special THANKSGIVING this Thanksgiving time. I shall write you next from Bombay, India. We are believing God for big things and we want you to join hands with us in doing the work whereunto God has called us.
