Greetings to Our Many Friends and Helpers:

Our three months spiritual goodwill mission to India is a memory, but what a joy. We shall never forget the wonderful people we met or the doors that were opened to us, nor shall we or thousands of people in India forget the victories that were wrought in the precious Name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

The three months passed rapidly, but it did allow us ample time to visit 13 states of India, 17 major cities and many other towns and villages. We lived and ate with many of the different communities that make up the life and culture of India. We were with Christians, Hindus, Moslems, Sikhs, Parsees, and Jains. We visited and studied Foreign Missions in India as well as the Indian National Christian work, about which we will have much to say in a later publication when we return to the States. We will then publish for all to read the facts concerning the case and how we were treated.

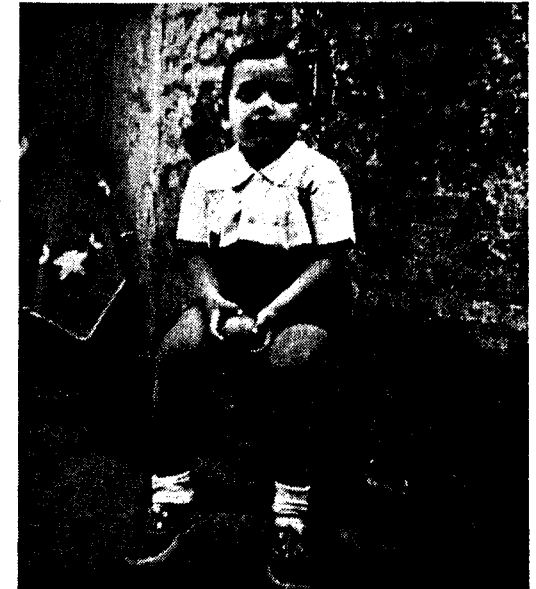
Before setting sail from Bombay, India on February 11 we were again entertained in the most royal Indian way. We returned to Bombay from Dehli on February 8th to begin our packing, which after all is a task when traveling with five people, and when I could not help because of engagements.

The Governor of Bombay had invited us for an interview on the 8th, and because of the success of our goodwill mission and the information we had gathered on the Foreign Mission system, the Governor was further interested and concerned and invited us for a special tea on the 10th.

In Dehli, the seat of the Central Government, we were graciously received and invited for special interviews on February 7th by the Vice-President of India, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan with whom we had tea in his residence. More will be written about this interview and all the others we had with the Central Government officials, as well as the Governors of States and Chief Ministers.

In Dehli, the Defense Minister, Dr. K. N. Katju and Naulana Abulkalam Azad, Minister of Education, both ac-

corded us much time and discussed with us the Indian National Church situation and the continued goodwill between the people of India and America. Some of the important details of the meetings with these high government officials can not be disclosed at this writing, but in due time we shall publish and set before the American people and the world some urgent and significant facts.

On February 9 and 10 we also held a convention in Bombay at which it was voted to launch a branch of The Way ministry with headquarters in Bombay and with branches for each state of India to be established as soon as possible, all under and by the independent National Christians without any foreign system of control. The Bombay headquarters will have as general overseer, Dr. H. S. Williams and Mr. James Johns as secretary.

On the evening of February 10th a grand farewell dinner was held at which leading men of various communities expressed their appreciation for our coming to India, and to all the people of America who supported us and made our

Mission possible. They love you all and bless you for sending us and bringing the love of Jesus Christ and the positive Gospel of the Word of God with its deliverance.

One February 11th at 2:30 P.M. we left the Taj Mahal hotel with all our belongings to board the ship, Chusan. Many friends from various places in India and Bombay paid visits to us in our hotel on the 9th and 10th and more than fifty of them came to see us off. At 4 P. M. we started through the Medical Department, then emigration, passage and finally customs and by 5 P. M. we were on ship which, however, did not sail until 9 P. M. Yet, many of our friends waited outside in the visitors area for our sailing. The Williams family and a few others had passes and were allowed on ship with us until 8 P. M.

Yes, at 9 P. M. the ship Chusan loosed anchor and with our handkerchiefs waving from the ship's port side and their handkerchiefs waving from shore, until the ship moved out to sea that neither of us could see the other any longer. "Part-

ing is such sweet sorrow," but the contributions and enriching fellowships that were made on both sides will continue to bear fruit both in America and India.

Many people throughout India responded so lovingly to the positive Gospel of the Word that people were saved, healed and made whole. A young boy was healed of hernia instantly, and a miracle of the casting out of many evil spirits was wrought on an aged mother 95 years old who had been bound for 30 years. After deliverance she was free to talk about her former enslavement by the evil spirits and she blessed God and us for her deliverance. I know you all rejoice with us for all that has been wrought in the name of Jesus Christ.

We are now visiting the Bible lands of Egypt and Palestine. Your prayers for our continued success will be answered. We have not been sick nor have we ever been in danger, and we believe our delivering God will continue to open the doors for our tour of peace and goodwill. Our hearts are thrilled to think that God has granted us such a privilege through you, his people. It is a joy of inexpressible words to walk the way and see the places where my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ walked; and to traverse the land where men of God, the prophets, apostles, and disciples labored that we might know Him whom to know is life eternal. The Eternal God is our refuge and underneath are His everlasting arms.
