The day of Pentecost is a very special day to us as Christians. It was on this day, many years ago, that the Christian Church began.

Just before Jesus Christ ascended (went up) into heaven, he prepared his apostles for the day of Pentecost. In Acts 1:4 Jesus told the twelve NOT to depart (leave) from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father.

The apostles obeyed Jesus' instructions. They remained in Jerusalem. While they were in the city, they went to the temple every day to pray. When they prayed, they would sit quietly on the floor with their legs crossed in front of them. The reason Jesus told the apostles to wait for the promise of the Father (which is the gift of holy spirit) is because it was not yet available. No one, except God, knew just WHEN this gift would be given.

Acts 2:1 tells us that when the day of Pentecost arrived, the twelve apostles were all together in one place. We know from Luke 24 that they were together IN THE TEMPLE.

Acts 2:2 says, "And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind and it filled all the house (the Temple) where they were sitting. The word "heaven" in the Bible always means any place above the earth.


Jesus Christ had instructed his apostles in John 20:22 that when the gift of holy spirit was given, they were to breathe in to receive it. The apostles breathed in and it was the sound of their breathing that sounded like a rushing, mighty wind. To get an idea of what this sounded like, you can go into an empty, quiet room. Sit very quietly on the floor. Breathe in and out very deeply. Can you hear the sound of your breathing? It is easy to see how the breathing of the twelve men could sound like wind.

Acts 2:3 tells us, "And there appeared unto them (the twelve apostles) cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them" Cloven means split. This verse says these cloven (split) tongues were LIKE fire, but they were not really fire. When the Word says the cloven tongues "sat," it means the gift was completely given. There was no more to give.

Jesus Christ had told the twelve apostles about the gift of holy spirit from God. However, the appearing of the cloven tongues is even MORE than what God had promised! Whenever God does even MORE than what He promises in His Word, it is called "phenomenon." The appearing of the cloven tongues is the phenomenon of Pentecost.


In Acts 2:4 it says, "And they (the twelve apostles) were all filled with the Holy Ghost (the gift of holy spirit) and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit (God) gave them utterance (speech). All twleve apostles spoke in tongues when they received the gift of holy spirit. When WE confess Romans 10:9,10, WE are born again and receive the gift of holy spirit, just as the apostles did! WE can speak in tongues, which is perfect prayer and praise to God.

The gift of holy spirit was FIRST given to the twelve apostles on the day of Pentecost and it has been available ever since! We celebrate Pentecost because it was on that day, so many years ago, that the gift of holy spirit was given for the first time!

On the day of Pentecost the twelve apostles spoke in tongues for the first time. Somewhere in the picture are hidden the twelve apostles. See if you can find them all!






Bible Animals




