

Word-Conditioned Believers



Have you ever heard grown-ups talk about the importance of being "Word-conditioned," rather than "world-conditioned?" Do you know what that means?

To be "world-conditioned" means to allow yourself to think positively or negatively because of the things that happen around you. For example, if someone bought you an ice cream cone, you could ALLOW yourself to become very happy. If they gave you a ride on their new bike, you could DECIDE to be excited on the inside.

However, God does not want us to be world-conditioned because SOMETIMES negative things do happen. For example, if you misplaced your favorite toy, you could ALLOW yourself to become absolutely miserable until you found it. If someone called you a nasty name, you COULD allow yourself to believe their untruthful words.

A "Word-conditioned" believer does not allow himself to become upset by the things that happen around him. No matter what happens, he always believes what the Word says. For example, if someone called him a nasty name, he would simply ask himself, "What does the WORD say I am? It says I am a son of God with all power." As we believe what the Word says, we will not be disturbed by the untruthful words of others.

Acts 16 tells us about two men, named Paul and Silas, who were "Word-conditioned." These men were speaking and believing God's Word and the unbelieving leaders got very angry! They whipped Paul and Silas many times, threw them into prison, and had their feet put in stocks. Stocks were used to hold the feet in place so they could not move.

This COULD have made Paul and Silas very upset. They COULD have said, "Oh, no, this is frightening. I wonder what else these men will do to us. I think we should just give up."


No! That is not what they did at all! Acts 16:25 says, "And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them."

Acts 16:26 says, "And suddenly there was a great earthquake so that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened, and everyone's bands were loosed." (These bands were around their feet.) The earthquake was SO powerful that all the doors were opened and the stocks came loose!

The jailer, who had been sleeping, woke and became VERY frightened. He knew that if a prisoner ever got away, the jailer would be killed. The jailer took out a sword to kill himself, but Paul called to him, "Don't kill yourself, for we are all here!" The jailer then bowed down at the feet of Paul and Silas and asked, "What must I do to be saved?" He wanted to become born again!

Paul and Silas taught the jailer God's Word. The guard took these men to his home where they taught his whole family the greatness of God's Word. The entire family listened and believed! They rejoiced at God's Word which they had learned.







Word-Conditioned Believer's Box




Materials:

Empty cigar box (most drugstores have them), construction paper or colorful wrapping paper, glue, scotch tape, scissors, crayons, ribbon

What to do:

- 1. Wipe off the empty cigar box with a damp cloth to be sure it is clean.
- 2. Cover the bottom section of the box with construction paper or wrapping paper. Be sure to use a big enough piece of paper so that it can cover the sides and be taped to the inside of the box. (You MIGHT want to ask a grown-up to help you on this.)
- 3. Cover the top of the lid.
- 4. Draw an open Bible on black paper and cut it out.
- 5. Cut out white paper to use as the inside page of the Bible.
- 6. Glue them to the top of your box.
- 7. Add a ribbon bookmark if you like, or decorate the rest of the box with your crayons.
- 8. As you use this treasure box to store your small treasures, you can remember to be a "Word-Conditioned" believer!


