Excerpts from Rev. Martindale's teaching on The Great Mystery--April 20-23--at The Way College:

"Every administration has an essence, a standard, a criterion, an ethic. Essence means the basic or necessary constituent of a reality or entity. The essence of this administration is wrapped up in the all truth of the seven church epistles.

"The best way that I know to see the heart of what's available in this administration is to look at the two prayers in Ephesians.

"If we're on the mystery, then we're walking the law of the spirit of life in Christ Jesus. If we're off the mystery, we're walking by the law of sin and death.

"We need to have our minds in the heavenlies and our feet on the ground.

"We're to tenaciously hold the great mystery in a pure conscience.
