"God honors our best. When I speak in tongues and lift someone, I may not know what the person looks like, but I sure have that name smack-dab in front of my face."

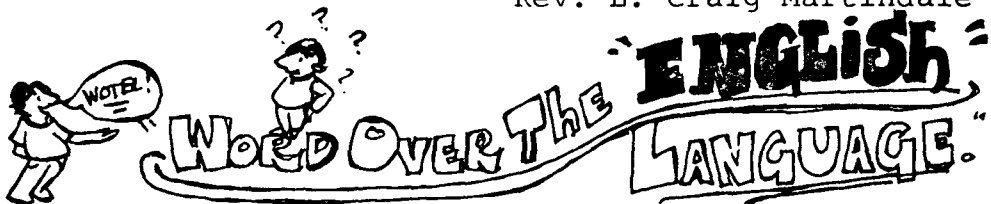

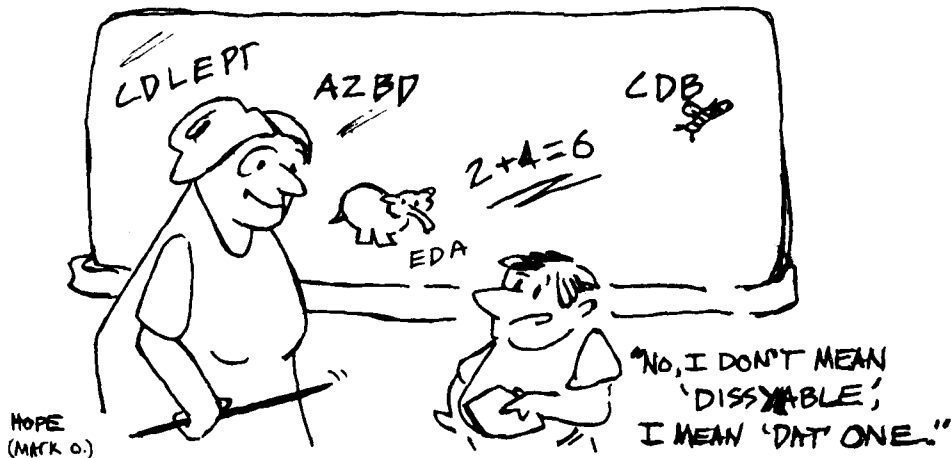

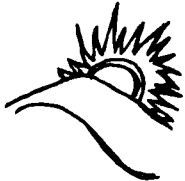
# WORD • AT • WORK
