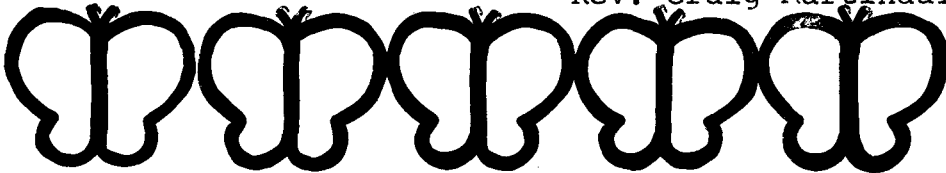

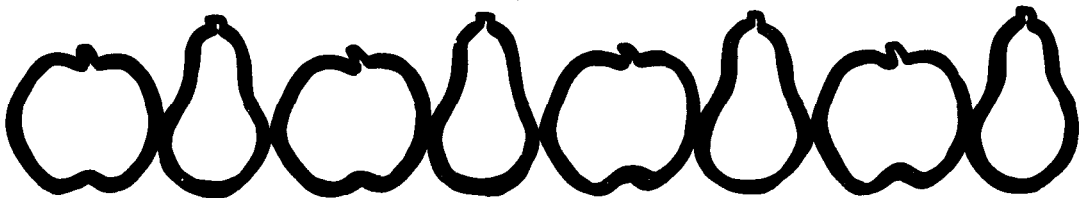

1. It's a present, so we can play with it.
2. It allows us to abundantly share to bear fruit.
3. It teaches us to think through what we spend it on; when we're responsible for the money of a Branch or Limb, we will be able to trust our decisions that we are seeking God first.
- *4. It increases your thankfulness for the minute details of how God blesses your life--things money can't buy.
5. You learn obedience--spend no more; stick with it and don't try to get out of it.
6. It provides an opportunity for many to change their habits and to believe for God's abundance without spending money.
7. It gives you an opportunity to give that which you are and not that which the world produces (cars, labels, etc.).
8. It teaches us that we are complete in Christ and to travel lightly.
9. The Corps does it together as a family--an experience shared.
10. Even with no money, we always have personal abundance to give.
