

Jesus Christ the Passover Lamb – I Corinthians 5:7

Date	Feast of the Passover	Type of Jesus Christ
------	-----------------------	----------------------

10 th Nisan Saturday	Choose the lamb. Procession from Mount of Olives into Jerusalem with waving palm branches, sing of Psalms 118.	Jesus comes into Jerusalem and joins the parade on a colt, with people shouting "Blessed is the King that cometh in the name of the Lord." Luke 19:28-38.
11 th – 13 th Nisan Saturday - Tuesday	Cleaning leaven out of houses	Jesus cast out moneychangers, "My house is a house of prayer." Luke 19:45 & 46
	Keep lamb tied in prominent place in the temple.	Jesus went to the temple every day.
	Examine the lamb to be sure it is without spot or blemish. I Peter 1:19.	Jesus examined by all: Pharisees, Sadducees, Herodians, and elders.
Evening, beginning of 14 th Nisan Tuesday evening		Lord's supper – teaches the meaning of bread and wine – this was not a Passover meal (Seder).
	Examine house in silence for leaven (with candles) Zephaniah 1:12.	Jesus arrested and examined before Sanhedrin – Does not answer (Silence).
14 th Nisan Wednesday	Lamb tied to altar at 3 rd hour. Lamb slain at ninth hour. (Between the evenings)	Jesus crucified at 3 rd hour and dies on cross at ninth hour. (3:00 PM).
	No bone is broken, blood poured out.	No bone is broken, side is pierced and blood poured out.
17 th Nisan Saturday afternoon	Sheaf of barley is harvested and preparations begun to make into flour	Jesus resurrection on Saturday evening (Exactly 72 hours after burial).
		Appears to Mary Magdalene and other women
18 th Nisan Sunday (Day after weekly Sabbath)	Wave offering on "morrow after the Sabbath" at time of morning sacrifice (around 6 AM). Lev. 23:10 & 11.	Jesus goes to his Father and presents himself as the first fruits. Also goes to the Temple. (I Corinthians 15:20).
		Next appearances – woman are allowed to touch him (Matthew 28:9)
