## Changes to Punctuation:

- 1. Where reference is made to two consecutive verses, the word "and" is used rather than a comma between the verses. Example: "Philippians 2:15 and 16" instead of "Philippians 2:15, 16."
- 2. When part of a verse is quoted, ellipses are added before and after the quote.

Example of the old style:

Romans 12:2 states that we ourselves have to put on Christ and God's Word in our minds: "be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind."

Example of the new style:

Romans 12:2 states that we ourselves have to put on Christ and God's Word in our minds: "...be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind..."

3. When a number of verses are being quoted and are broken up by an explanation, the numbering after the break is different.

Example of the old style:

Luke 11:11:

If a son shall ask bread of any of you that is a father, will he give him a stone? Or if *he ask* a fish, will he for a fish give him a serpent?

Suppose you had a son who was hungry, and you had bread in your house. If he asked for it, would you give him a stone? I am sure you would not.
