Look at Paul's life in Acts 9:1-31; 26:1-18; Philippians 3:4-14. He profitably referred to his life and deliverance several times.

Have your sharings sent to The Way College of Emporia in typed form by our 37th Anniversary on October 7, 1979. I have assigned Marcia Faulk to coordinate the work. Send your papers to her at the college and include your name, address and phone number.

This is my heart, so help me make it happen. The Corps is prayerfully on my heart and mind day and night. Hold it high! I love you.
