My dear Way Corps:

Peace and grace to each and every one of you from God our Father. Yes—it is PEACE because we are no longer in enmity toward God and at loggerheads with Him because of what He did for us in Christ, and GRACE because it is God's unmerited, divine favor which is the absolute end of all of man's work. God is our Father—no struggle, no fight, no wondering if you're going to walk tomorrow because we are in Him and He is in us, our Father.

As we are on our historic South American Presidential Itinerary, my heart is so full of thanksgiving and rejoicing for our wonderful ministry—God's ministry, as it reaches out around the world and for you, my Way Corps. God has called you, The Way Corps, to carry the spiritual responsibility of the ministry, that it continues to reach out and touch others lives.

The greatness of your spiritual walk is not simply meeting your obligations, but also what you do with your self-structured time. What the world calls spare time, we in the Corps call self-structured time. Who really has time to spare? Certainly not those who are dedicated to moving God's Word over the world.

Your obligations include the things that need to be done in a day's time—time with God, His heart (the Word) and speaking in tongues; time with your family and job and time for your ministry responsibilities. What you have left, which is many times moments in a day or before 8 a.m., you self-structure constructively or leave to run its course. Time can be your undoing.

We in the Corps spend our self-structured time developing ourselves, body, soul and spirit. Someone said that "small minds discuss people, average minds discuss current events, great minds discuss the Word of God."

Remember—God's Spirit teaches His creation in you which is now your spirit and your spirit teaches your mind. Then it becomes manifested in the senses realm as you act. Yes, God does work in you both to will and to do of His good pleasure. Perhaps you could say from the world's standpoint that the world's "wisdom", through their technicians, teaches your television which can infiltrate your mind. For the most part television is only a biased wasteland that wastes minds. "Getting High on Yourself," parading the lame and halt and their patrons to manipulate money from guilty consciences, promoting the twentieth century version of the "games" under the guise of entertainment, etc., etc., etc., does not build anything for the future.

In his work on "Originality" Emerson stated:

Whoever looks at the insect world, at flies, aphids, gnats, and innumberable parasites, . . . must have remarked the extreme content they take in suction, which constitutes the main business of their life . . . go into a . . . newsroom . . . see the same function on a higher plane, performed with like ardor, with equal impatience of interruption, indicating the sweetness of the act.

Perhaps if Emerson had been around today he would have included the viewing rooms of almost every home where the television set reigns supreme.

The stream of affection flows broad and strong; . . . but the dearth of design accuses the penury of intellect. How few thoughts!

We cannot overstate our debt to the Past, but the moment has the supreme claim. The Past is for us; but the sole terms on which it can become ours are its subordination to the Present. Only an inventor knows how to borrow, and every man is or should be an inventor.

Genius is . . . sensibility, the capacity of receiving just impressions . . . and the power of coordinating these after the laws of thought. It implies Will, . . . for their right distribution and expression.

We are the pacesetters of our generation as we discuss and formulate in our minds the great things of God, His ministry and Word. Reading, writing and constructive conversation will help develop

mental agility and clearness of expression. The Corps should be working the Word such as a new research project, reading other men's thoughts and lives such as the Harvard Classics and then using the basis of the Word to form your own ideas and approaches, writing when inspired to do so. These are the things that help build for the future. Way Corps should be eager to learn everything they can about any subject. One of our conservative statesmen stated that the goal of our learning today should be to "absorb the wisdom of the ancients and apply it to the problems of today." Too bad more do not practice what they preach. How true the proverb, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." As it reads in the Sanskrit, "Where there is no knowledge of God, the people wander aimlessly." The Corps are the ones who can supply that direction with the light of God's Word. Only the Word of God spoken on the lips of believing believers can truly "build for a better tomorrow."

Some have other ideas. Laurentia Beria, head of the soviet secret police under Stalin, shared of a master plan to conquer the world: "Give us one generation and you'll never be able to catch up." Give us one generation who will stand for the accuracy and integrity of God's Word and the enemy won't be able to see us for dust. We can take the lead when God leads the way and we faithfully follow.

In excerpts from his writings and statements given over 40 years ago, Beria stated:

... Man is a collective animal ... those who ... control him must have ... specialized techniques to direct ... man toward ... the goals of the state. Psycopolitics is the art and science of asserting and maintaining dominion over the thoughts and loyalties ... through "mental healing." It is of utmost importance that the psychopolitical operatives infiltrate the healing arts of a nation.

Psychoanalysis . . . can be made fashionable throughout mental health organizations . . . . Constant pressure . . . can bring about legislation . . . that every student attending a high school or university must have classes in psychology . . . . Labor until we have dominion over the minds and bodies of every important person . . . You can change their loyalties by psychopolitics. In rearranging loyalties, we must have a command of their values. . . . You are aided on all sides by the corruption of the philosophy of man in the times.

Use the courts, use the judges, use the constitution of the country, use its medical societies and its laws to further our ends . . . Effect your own legislation at will . . . By psychopolitics create chaos. Leave a nation leaderless.

Children normally furnish the best targets, and these can be operated against without restraint. . . . By making readily available drugs of various kinds, by giving the teenager alcohol, by praising his wildness, by stimulating him with sex literature . . . the psychopolitical operator can create the necessary attitude of chaos, idleness, and worthlessness. . . . If we could effectively kill the national pride and patriotism of just one generation, we will have won that country.

... we had to destroy, after many, many years of the most arduous work, the Church; so we must destroy all faiths and nations marked for conquest... We have battled in America since the century's turn to bring to nothing any and all Christian influences and we are succeeding.

It may happen that remedies for our "treatments" may be discovered. . . . It may thus occur that all mental healing might be placed in the hands of ministers and be taken out of the hands of our psychologists and psychiatrists . . . should they occur, should independent researchers actually discover means to undo psychopolitical procedures, he must not rest, he must not eat or sleep, he must not stint one tiniest bit of available money to campaign against it, discredit it, strike it down and render it void. For, by an effective means, all our actions and researches could be undone.

Through hindsight, it is interesting to note how much of a "master" plan given over 40 years ago has already been successfully implemented and made a mark on our nations. However, the end result has not been accomplished because of God's grace and mercy and the stand of believers.

It is the independent research of our ministry that continues to suppress the enemy's efforts.

However, ours is not only to hold down but to take command and lead the way. We cannot afford to let down our guard or lessen our vigilant stand.

We must respond to our calling, which is God's intense desire for us to stand in one body with Christ as the head as the united household of God. We don't have time to fight each other. The Corps needs to join each other and fight the Devil.

The responsibility of being Corps, and especially clergy, far outweighs the honor. God truly has given us a generation, our generation, to move the Word over the world. God has a plan also—each one reach one with God's Word and win that one to the household.

We must continue to remember and hold before our people that we are a Research (rightly-dividing the God-breathed Word, II Timothy 2:15; 3:16,17)—Teaching (right understanding that comes from the right teaching of the rightly-divided Word, Acts 8:30-35; Luke 24:45)—and Fellowship ministry (right application of the right teaching of God's Word that yields the true fruit of righteousness, I John 2:3-5; 3:18-24; 4:16,17; 5:2-4).

The history of tyranny has shown that those who would endeavor to control others have always targeted youth—an obvious commitment beyond the lives of its founders to control the future. In order to fulfill God's manifest spiritual destiny, we need to continue to realize the significance of reaching the young people of today and sharing God's Word with them that the Word can prevail beyond our lives. God's promise is to the third generation if believers stand (Psalm 103:17,18).

William the Conqueror once stated, "Men, you must win; I have burned the ships." In The Way Ministry and for us in the Corps, there is only one way to go—that's forward. We have reached the point of no return. Our bridges are burned. Go to Him daily and claim His grace and mercy. Refute the past and reach forth unto those things which are before. All escape routes have been cut off. We walk forward; we move forward, building new roads, new bridges, new highways for those who desire to travel, not on the detours of life, not on the back roads or the mud roads of life, but on the highway, the only way, marked "Glory Road." For us in the Corps, the bottom line is still, "It Is Written."

I recently viewed our new film, "One of a Kind" which is scheduled for release at our 40th Anniversary Weekends. Many of our people who saw it, including myself, felt it was a film of intense heart and impact as it showed the great "roots" of our ministry and how it had been built over the years to this point in time. It should not only prove to be a great blessing during this 40th Anniversary year but in the years to come as our posterity looks to the heritage of believing we set for them.

Truly the future, immediate and long-term, rests in our hands which are to rest in Him. To quote our video production on The Way Corps, "Never has the destiny of so many rested in the hands and believing of so few." In order for people today to be able to arrive at an intelligent decision between alternative courses of action, they need a knowledge of God's Word, and the Corps are those called to carry that knowledge . . . commitment is simply saying "yes" to the Word day after day and many times moment after moment.

Daniel 11:32b:

But the people that do know [by experience] their God shall be strong [bound together] and do exploits.

May that be our heart as Way Corps as we continue with one mind and one mouth proclaiming the greatness of His Word to those around us as we respond to His call to love. Pray for me. Know that I pray for you.
