



Dear Way Corps:

I knew that if you honestly put your recall, heart and mind into gear, putting your life and deliverance on paper, it would bless you to see how much God really did for you. I appreciated your response. I promised you it would be totally private, unless you personally gave me permission to use it. I have kept my commitment to you.

Recently the Department of Immigration requested copies of the Hispanic Corps' sharings and our Legal department refused their request. Then our Legal department told the Board of Trustees that there was a possibility that a judge might order me to release the sharings. This I absolutely refuse to do for I am a clergyman and your sharing of the privacy of your life is a sacred trust to me which I would never betray.

Under no condition are you personally required to give it to any department of the government, and under no circumstance would I ever betray the confidence and trust you put in me. I have no key to the lockbox of my soul, God has it. If they want it, they must get it from Him.

I trust you will personally keep your sharing some place and ten years from now read it again and see how wonderfully God has blessed your life. Note Paul's sharing from his birth to the "ministry of serving" in Philippians 3:1-14, Acts 9:1-31; 26:1-18.

I had some other thoughts today and my heart is blessed to share them with you for what they may be worth personally to and for you, and maybe you can use and share some of them with your Twig.

You know, years ago I learned that someone is always giving me orders. Like in school they told me what to read and study, told me when to take an exam, etc. In the logic of that, I arrived one day at the greatest conclusion regarding all my thinking; namely, then why not take orders from God--not from people, not religion, not tradition--but from His, God's Word. So, I looked at my life and with the greatest reality of understanding I had, I waived good-bye to the past and left it all behind thinking of it as the Apostle Paul said in Philippians 3:7, 8, "what things were gain to me those I counted loss for the excellency of Christ Jesus my lord and counted them but dung for Christ." Then I moved up to a new level of thinking and believing. I no longer think about myself, I think about what God thinks. Previously, I was constantly running away and I had mind lapses, day dreaming, even weary with my own self and life. But, after that decision and to this day, I have learned to live and enjoy simple, beautiful, tender, kind, loving and many other pleasures of life. Philippians 4:8 is my daily thinking along with I Corinthians 13:5, "thinketh no evil."

Sometimes I feel so blessed that I almost feel guilty, and for moments of time my mind says "it's too good to be true," can it really last? The next moment I again stay my mind to the great reality of God's Word realizing that by God's grace and mercy I am what I am and I will be far beyond what I could over personally have hoped to be.

So you too must make up your mind whether you will follow fossilized tradition or the living truth. Traditional religion usually means an inaction or when acting, cruelty. The history of religion is the history of wars.

The Corps: We have not arrived where we are going. So get your mind expanded and drop all the thick layers of shells around your hearts.

The Corps is called to the "front and center." We are God's Corps on the front line of action.

The Corps keeps moving ahead in God's Word.

The Corps takes people from the level they are to the level where God wants them.

The Corps enlivens degraded souls.

The Corps believers have a function in the Body rather than a position.

The Corps as great men and women of God enjoy the responsibility of carrying and bringing the light of the greatness of God's Word to the world.

God's grace of life, Psalm 30:5, is in remembrance and salvation, Psalm 106:4, mercy, Isaiah 60:10, and preservation, Psalm 86:2.
