Flag Raising

During LIVING VICTORIOUSLY the flags of the United States of America and the state of Ohio will be raised in all weather conditions and at all hours because as believers we are in a 24-hour-a-day spiritual contest. According to United States protocol, our nation's flag is flown round-the-clock during war and must be lighted at night, as ours are.

Promptly at 6:00 a.m. each morning a military color guard is present at both flag locations (south of the Biblical Research Center and east of the Gazebo).

During the ceremony, across the grounds can be heard the music of "Waiting for the Sunrise," "America the Beautiful," "The Star Spangled Banner" and "Beautiful Ohio." At this time also there is an opening prayer by Dr. Wierwille to set the heart and vision for the day.

At the base of the flagpole next to the Biblical Research Center lies a memorial plaque to Bishop K.C. Pillai of India. At the opening flag raising Dr. Wierwille explained the significance of this plaque, which to him represents the moving of the Word of God around the world.

Everyone is invited to attend this morning ceremony to begin the day with prayer and a salute to this country where all men are free to hold forth the Word of God.

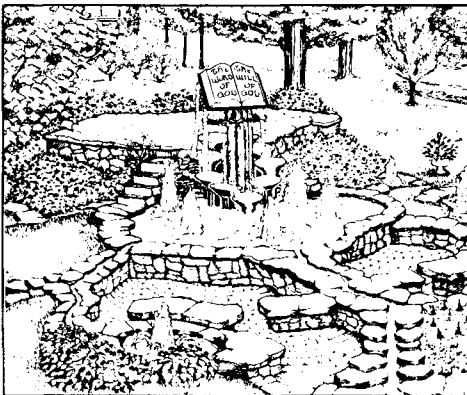

Dear Folks,

LIVING VICTORIOUSLY is a masterpiece! The Way Big Top Auditorium, the beautiful landscaping, the displays, the delicious food, and most of all the thousands of wonderful believers with God's Word in their hearts—40 history-making years to bring about this tremendous class!

Today I went to the original Biblical Research Center (everyone calls it the BRC) and sat in one of the chairs where faithful believers fellowshiped for so many years in Sunday night services at "The Way." What a feeling, knowing I am part of a chain of believing that goes back 40 years.

There were only 120 chairs in the BRC; that's all that were needed to seat everyone in the early 1960s. Isn't it amazing? Now we have almost 8,000 here for this class. About 300 are here from other nations. I met the Country coordinator of Cameroon. He went there all alone and has helped more than 100 people to take the class on Power For Abundant Living. He speaks some English, but French is his native tongue. All the teachings here are being translated into three languages: Spanish, German and French.

Dr. Wierwille opened LIVING VICTORIOUSLY with a tremendous teaching Saturday evening. I'll show you my notes when we come home. And, Jerry Carr helped us to our seats! He's the Limb coordinator of Georgia. All the ushers and set-up crew in the Way Big Top Auditorium are Limb coordinators. Rev. Carr said, "It helps put things in the right perspective to be able to serve people this way."
