From the War Zone To the Peace Zone

Ines Ross, a British subject living in Argentina, and Andrea Richter, a 1981-82 WOW Ambassador in Argentina, are very thankful to be attending LIVING VICTORIOUSLY.

"Some of our young men in the fellowships have been called into the army, but by God's grace none of them had to go to battle on the front lines," said Ines. "Each time it seemed they would have to go to fight, God would have His hand on their lives and they would be re-assigned. His protection is so evident.

"In one case," Ines said, "a believer was headed for the front lines, but orders came down to move him to an office job. His commanding officer insisted that he could not switch, but the higher ranking officer moved him anyway. And none of the men have ever had to miss a Twig fellowship because of being in the army."

"The Word is on the move in Argentina," Andrea said, "and things are ready to burst. People are groping for answers and only the Word has the answers for them."
